

# MUI Test

Please refer to the MUI power point presentation to assist with locating the answers to the following questions:

1. All incidents start out as an unusual incident (UI) and should be documented on an unusual incident form. Determination is then made by the County Board Investigative Agent or designee if the incident rises to a higher level which would be categorized as a Major Unusual Incident (MUI). When should an unusual incident report be written?
  - A. When something occurs that is not consistent with routine operations
  - B. When an individual wants to talk to their SSA (Service and Support Administrator)
  - C. When it's an individual's birthday
  - D. When you don't agree with your supervisor
  
2. Does an incident report have to be written if you do not think it is a Major Unusual Incident?
  - A. Yes

3. How soon do you need to write an incident report if something unusual occurs?
